<p>Discussion A: Rapid Responder Rapid Responder is commonality for both city and county schools and responders Implement a mandatory annual review policy – to include Rapid Responder review, training, and updates on an annual level</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Create an agreement between SPD, County Sheriff, School Districts, and other 1st Responders that all partners involved use and create a system for regular updates (move Rapid Responder to priority in job descriptions vs. “other duties as assigned”) <p>Discussion B: Existing City/County Wide Crisis Response document agreement from 1999 Document titled “Coordination Response for Prevention/Intervention for Juvenile Violence” Should element group revisit this document as a foundation? Has established protocol with roles and responsibilities for emergency situations</p> <p>Discussion C: NIMS Model (National Incident Management System) Has four components: 1) Preparedness 2) Response 3) Recovery 4) Mitigation (prevention) In the last 6 months, bug push at the federal level Has a training requirement (in order to receive deferral funding) All school districts have signed off on NIMS model (was adopted by the Medical Lake School District Board Spring 2006) This model could be critical “common link” between all the necessary components and partners – Includes “requirement” component (not optional as Rapid Responder)</p> <p>Rick: I added this website link which I found in looking for additional information on the NIMS model. It is a timing issue right now On hold until new SPD chief has time to review. West Central Neighborhood group still heated. Community group members would like the project to be implemented right away. They also have are cautious about the project being “police driven” Next West Central Community/Neighborhood Gang Prevention Task Force group meeting will focus on “debriefing” from delegate visit. Due to ongoing community concerns and group dynamics, it may be important for members of Safety element group to attend this meeting to support Lisa Rosier.
